What is a Sea Grant Knauss Marine Policy Fellow?

The Knauss Marine Policy Fellowship is an educational opportunity for graduate students to spend one year in Washington, DC, learning about marine policy. Fellows receive a \$45,000 stipend and additional travel funds to work with federal agencies and Congress on diverse and interesting projects.

Fellows are encouraged to interview with host offices both within and outside their current field. Explore new career opportunities or gain more experience in your field of study.

What do you need to apply to the Knauss Fellowship?

- Interest in how science and policy work together in the government
- Some experience in outreach, education and/or policy
- Personal statement, two letters of recommendation (one from your major professor), 2-page resume, transcripts, and a listing of classes and plans for 2016

What else should you know?

Applications are due to state Sea Grant programs in February 2016. Finalists for the fellowship will be announced in June 2016, and the fellowship will begin Feb 1, 2017.

Many Fellows leverage their fellowship experience to find jobs in DC in federal agencies, Congress, non-profit organizations, and more. Others find positions back home, or go back to academia with an increased understanding of how their research can inform policy.
